

RHODE ISLAND FAMILY COURT
ADMINISTRATIVE ORDER 98-10

RE: SEXUAL OFFENDER REGISTRATION AND COMMUNITY NOTIFICATION

In accordance with Rhode Island General Laws Title 11, Chapter 37.1 entitled the "Sexual Offender Registration and Community Notification Act", a juvenile who is adjudicated or admits to sufficient facts for offenses described in sub-section 11-37.1-2 of the act must register with the local police department for the city or town in which such juvenile intends to reside. A "Notice of Duty to Register" form has been developed to provide juveniles with written notice of the requirements of the act. (Please see attached notice).

Henceforth, the Notice of Duty to Register form should be delivered to and executed by a juvenile prior to an admission of sufficient facts or admission. The notice should also be provided to a juvenile at the time of sentencing after a finding of delinquency for the offenses enumerated in the act.

Pursuant to R.I. Gen. Laws §§11-37.1-3, 11-37.1-4, and 11-37.1-5, you are hereby notified of your duty to do the following:

- 1. Appear in person at the local police department for the city/town in which you intend to reside, register your current address with that department, and re-register with the same department on an annual basis for a period of ten (10) years after having been released from confinement, paroled, or placed on probation;
2. Verify your address in writing or in person with the local police department in the city/town in which you reside on a quarterly basis for the first two (2) years of the ten (10) year term;
3. If you have been determined to be a sexually violent predator, or are determined to be the same at some point in the future, you must register on an annual basis and verify your address quarterly in writing or in person until such time as the Court determines that you are no longer a sexually violent predator;
4. Any time you change your residence, you must provide your new address to the local police departments in both the city/town in which you resided before your move, and the city/town where you will be residing within ten (10) days of changing your residence; and
5. If you move your residence to another state, register your new address immediately with the local police department in which you resided before your move. If the state to which you are moving has a registration requirement that applies to you, you must also register your new address with the designated law enforcement agency in that state within ten (10) days after establishing residence in the new state.

Failure to comply with these obligations is a criminal offense under R.I. Gen. Laws §11-37.1-10, which is punishable by a term of imprisonment of not more than two (2) years and/or a fine of not more than two thousand dollars (\$2,000).
