(Attorney Reinstatement Procedure) :

ORDER

Rule 1(e) of Article IV of the Supreme Court Rules, entitled “Periodic registration of attorneys,” is hereby amended as follows:

“(e) An attorney whose name has been removed from the Master Roll solely for failure to file the registration statement may be reinstated upon filing the registration statement together with a late fee of one hundred twenty-five dollars (\$125.00) in addition to the appropriate annual registration fee, plus reimbursement of the costs of collection, except as hereinafter additionally provided in the case of attorneys practicing law outside this state.

Any attorney whose name has been removed from the Master Roll for failure to file the registration statement, and/or who has been suspended from the practice of law for non-payment of Bar Association dues, or who has been on inactive status, for a period in excess of six (6) months, shall file an application with this Court seeking reinstatement and provide a copy to this Court’s Disciplinary Counsel. The applicant for reinstatement shall submit an affidavit attesting that the applicant has not been disciplined in this or any other jurisdiction, that the applicant is not the subject of any pending disciplinary charges, and that the applicant is not aware of any reason why the application should not be granted.

Disciplinary Counsel shall provide this Court with a Report and Recommendation on the application within thirty (30) days.
