ORDER

James P. Devlin, Jr., is a member of the Bar of the Commonwealth of Massachusetts and the State of Rhode Island. On August 19, 2008, the Supreme Judicial Court of Massachusetts entered an order placing him on disability inactive status in the Commonwealth after finding that he was incapacitated from engaging in the practice of law. Devlin waived his right to a hearing in that matter, and assented to being placed on disability inactive status in the Commonwealth.

On September 24, 2008, through counsel, he requested that he be placed on inactive status in this State due to his incapacity. After review of the information he provided we deem it appropriate that his request be granted.

Accordingly, pursuant to the provisions of Article III, Rule 17 of the Supreme Court Rules, James P. Devlin, Jr., is transferred to inactive status due to incapacity until further Order of this Court.
