## **EXECUTIVE ORDER**

Pursuant to the authority invested in the Chief Justice of the Rhode Island Supreme Court by G.L. 1956 (2012 Reenactment) § 8-15-2 and in order to better facilitate the provision of competent legal representation for indigent defense services and certain civil panels, and to enhance the uniform and efficient payment of services therefor, Executive Order 13-07 is hereby amended as follows.
